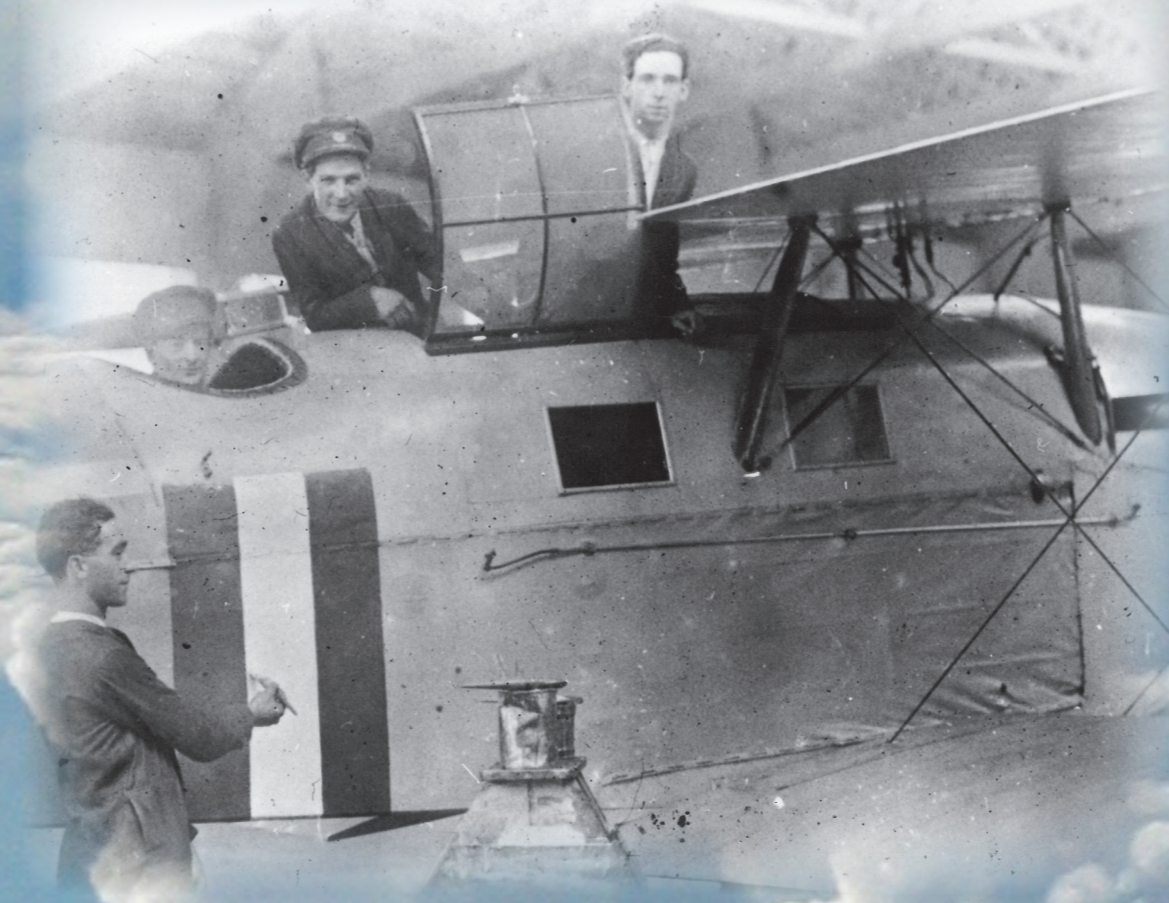


SOUTH DUBLIN COUNTY SKIES AND THE IRISH AIR CORPS SINCE 1922



The Irish Air Corps has operated from Casement Aerodrome, formerly known as Baldonnel, for nearly 90 years and has in that time been a constant presence in the skies over South Dublin County. In times of peace and war, fair weather and foul, day and night, the air has hummed to the sound of beating propellers, clattering rotors or whining jets as Air Corps aircraft and their crews have passed overhead in the course of their duty.

This offers a unique opportunity to fill in some of the details concerning your Air Corps and its association with South Dublin County.
