Further to the public notice, dated 7 December 2011, indicating your intention to examine every quarry in your administrative area we wish to make the following comments in respect of the above named quarry.

The Quarry, shown outlined in blue on the attached map, was registered under Section 261 of the Planning & Development Act 2000 (as amended) (South Dublin Quarry Ref. No. SDQU05A/3) and as a result South Dublin County Council decided that it required a planning application and EIS to be submitted in respect of the continued operation of the quarry.


A planning application and EIS were prepared in respect of the lands shown outlined in red on the attached map and submitted to South Dublin County Council on 1 June 2007 – Planning Ref. No. 07/0409. Further information was requested by the Planning Authority and was submitted on 31 January 2008. South Dublin County Council decided to grant planning permission for the continued operation of the quarry on 26 March 2008 subject to 30 conditions. A first party appeal and a number of third party appeals were lodged with An Bord Pleanala on or about 18 April 2008 in respect of the Planning Authority's decision – Ref. No. PL 06S.228842, and the Board decided to grant planning permission for the continued operation of Phase 1 of the proposed quarry development on 26 June 2009 subject to 23 conditions.

The Planning Authority was advised on 11 June 2010 that operations at the quarry were suspended on a temporary basis due to the economic downturn which is afflicting our business.

On the basis that a planning application and EIS were submitted to South Dublin County Council in June 2007 in respect of the continued operation of the quarry and that as a result, South Dublin County Council / An Board Pleanala decided to grant planning permission, no further action is required under Section 261A of the Planning and Development (Amendment) Act 2010.

Please note that we have an interest in the lands, shown outlined in magenta on the attached map adjoining the planning application lands referred to above, by way of a lease (copy attached), dated 10 November 1913, to quarry same.

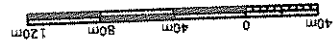

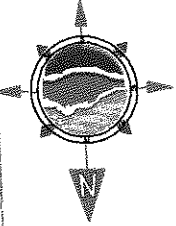
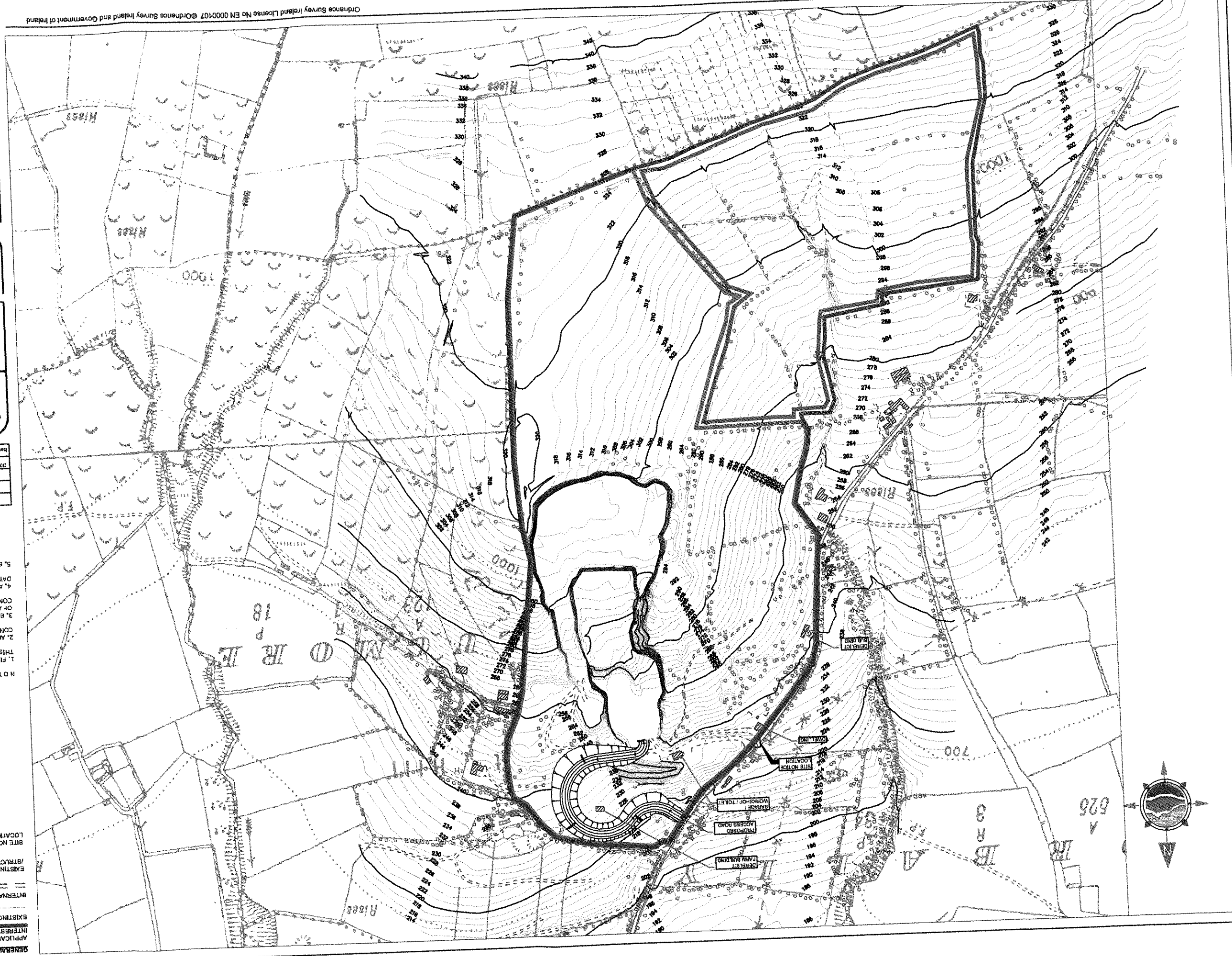

take copies of or extracts from the said books of account to be kept as aforesaid.

12. AND will place in some convenient place or places to be approved of by the Lessor or her agent or agents one or more good and properly constructed weighing machine or machines and will cause to be weighed therein all stone raised or got under or by virtue of these presents AND will cause the weights and quantities so ascertained to be forthwith duly registered at the weighing house or houses AND will also at the close of each day cause the total quantity of the stone weighed as aforesaid during the day to be entered in proper books or accounts to be kept for that purpose at the Counting House of the said Quarry in such manner that all stone subject to royalties shall be clearly distinguished and shown.

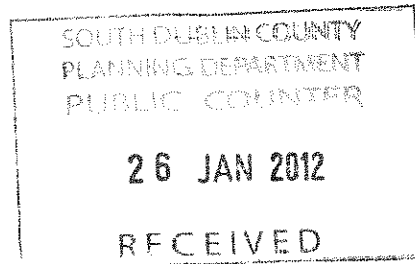

This submission is made on behalf of Shillelagh Quarries Ltd. with an address at Aghfarrell, Brittas, Co. Dublin in response to the public notice issued by South Dublin County Council in the Irish Times, dated 7th December 2011 inviting submissions or observations in relation to the statutory review of quarries under Section 261A of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended) – Further Matters in the Control of Quarries.

1.0 SECTION 261 REGISTRATION

Shillelagh Quarries Ltd. registered the quarry at Aghfarrell with South Dublin Co. Council as required under Section 261 of the Planning & Development Act, 2000 (Quarry Ref. No. SDQU05A/1) on the 20th April 2005.

A subsequent public notice issued by South Dublin County Council advised that the quarry at Aghfarrell was registered in accordance with Section 261 of the Planning & Development Act and stating;

'Planning permission has not been granted for this quarry. The PA is considering requiring the making of a planning application and the preparation of an environmental impact statement (EIS) in respect of the quarry in accordance with subsection (7) of Section 261 of the Act.

Notification to Shillelagh Quarries Ltd. by South Dublin County Council under Section 261(5) requested that a planning application and accompanying EIS be submitted in relation to the quarry at Aghfarrell.

2.0 PLANNING APPLICATION SUBMITTED UNDER SECTION 261

Shillelagh Quarries Ltd. submitted a planning application and accompanying EIS to South Dublin Co. Council. (Planning Ref. No. SD07A.0276), as required under the provisions of Section 261. This application includes the existing quarry area and a proposed extension area. South Dublin Co. Council issued a notification of decision to grant planning permission for the development. This decision was subject to first and third party appeals to An Bord Pleanála. The Board overturned South Dublin Co. Council's decision and refused planning permission.

Shillelagh Quarries Ltd. is currently engaged in court proceedings (Record No. 2011/154JR) with An Bord Pleanála in relation to the Board's decision to overturn the grant of planning permission by South Dublin County Council (Planning Ref. No. SD07A/0276 and ABP Ref. No. PL06S.231371) for the proposed development being:

“(A) Continuance of use of the existing quarry on lands that have been used for this purpose since before 1st October 1964 on a site registered under Section 261 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (Quarry Reference Number SDQU05A/1); (B) all existing ancillary facilities including the existing processing plant (crushing and screening plant), overburden storage areas, stockpile areas, water management system and the truck/vehicle parking area; (C) extension of the existing quarry extraction area by 4.2 hectares, within the registered area, to give a total extraction area of 15.5 hectares within an overall application area of 28.1 hectares; (D) provision of a wheelwash and hydrocarbon interceptor; (E) landscaping and final restoration of the site, all at Aghfarrell townland, Brittas, Co. Dublin.”

This submission in relation to Section 261A is made without prejudice to any position Shillelagh Quarries Ltd's may take in relation to and arising from the above High Court proceedings. In that regard, it is submitted, that it is appropriate to await the outcome of those proceedings, due to be heard in March 2012, before a determination is made on whether an application for substituted consent should be made

3.0 SECTION 261A

It is clear from the original quarry registration process that the local authority accepted the status of the quarry at Aghfarrell as being a quarry that commenced operation before 1st October 1964 and having an extraction area which was greater than 5 hectares at the time of registration and thereby registered it in accordance with subsection (7) of Section 261 of the Planning & Development Act.

Shillelagh Quarries Ltd. would also like to point out that it could have been quite conceivably foreseen before 1st October 1964 that the quarry would continue to operate and expand within the same single landholding boundary (Folio DN3636).

Shillelagh Quarries Ltd. has operated the quarry in accordance with the recommended environmental management guidelines for the sector (DoEHLG (2004) and EPA(2006). There is an ongoing environmental monitoring programme in place at the quarry that confirms compliance with the recommended emission limit values for noise, dust deposition

and air overpressure / groundborne vibration. The quarry operation is not resulting in significant effects on the environment.

It is respectfully requested that South Dublin County Council now make a determination that an application should be made to the Board for substitute consent with regard to the quarry at Aghfarrell under Section 261A (1)(b), being:

“that where the planning authority determines in relation to a quarry that an environmental impact assessment, a determination as to whether environmental impact assessment was required, or an appropriate assessment, was require but was not carried out and the planning authority also decides that –

- (i) The quarry commenced operation prior to 1st October 1964, or permission was granted in respect of the quarry under Part III of the Planning and Development Act 2000 or Part IV of the Local Government (Planning and Development) Act 1963, and*
- (ii) If applicable, the requirements in relation to registration under section 261 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 were fulfilled.”*

It is clear from the original quarry registration process that the local authority accepted the status of the quarry at Aghfarrell as being a quarry that commenced operation before 1st October 1964 and having an extraction area which was greater than 5 hectares and thereby required an application for planning permission and an EIS to be submitted in accordance with subsection (7) of Section 261 of the Planning & Development Act. Further, it is clear that the requirements in relation to registration under section 261 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 were fulfilled. In so far as the EIS that accompanied planning application (Planning Ref. No. SD07A.0276) is concerned, this was not exclusively for the quarry that commenced operation before 1st October 1964 as it considered other development, for example, the extension of the existing quarry extraction area by 4.2 hectares. Thus, it is submitted, that an environmental impact assessment for the quarry *per se* was required and was not carried out

We would like to make the following submission on Section 261A of the Planning and Development Act 2000 – 2011:-

(1) Shillelagh Quarries Limited. (SDQU 05A/1) and others

- (a) We must point out that SDCC granted planning permission to Shillelagh Quarries Limited "Ultra Vires". SDCC failed to carry out even a basic check of Public records despite the fact that we had requested a full investigation into this unauthorised quarry. SDCC failed to request from Shillelagh Quarries Limited proof of Pre- 1964 status, ownership of land, etc. despite knowing that it was an unauthorised quarry with a very long history.
- (b) We would like to know why the same planning officer who granted planning permission to Shillelagh Quarries Limited has been appointed enforcement officer to this case by Mr Horan. This is not appropriate or acceptable.
- (c) Both Section 261 and 261A are developer led and probably represent some of the most ill-conceived and blatant Legislation drafted in the Planning Act. Both section 261 and 261A are designed to legitimise unauthorised and fraudulent quarries in breach of ECJ C/215/06 , 85/337/EEC. Section 261A designed to give a second chance to the owners of the unauthorised quarries.
- (d) It is a scandal that the Minister for the Environment has enacted and is promoting such legislation.

- (d) Section 261A we believe is in breach of the ECJ case C/215/06. 85/337/EEC. This we believe will result in cases returning to the ECJ once again. Resulting in Large fines being levied on the citizen's of this State once again, as a result of Incompetent governance.

We request that SDCC carry out immediate enforcement action under Section 154 for this unauthorised quarry (Shillelagh Quarries Limited). The decision by An Bord Pleanala was made on the 24-12-2010 and we believe SDCC have not taken any enforcement action to date.

(2) Kilsaran Concrete Limited:- SDQU05A/6

- (a) SDCC granted an extra 6.676 Hectares for quarrying without Kilsaran Concrete Limited making any planning application for such a development. The area of this quarry is now 31.876 Hectares.
- (b) No adequate Environmental Impact Assessment/Appropriate assessment was carried out prior to the grant of planning permission to Kilsaran Concrete Limited.
- (c) This quarry was granted an additional 5 years duration in the planning permission to 2017. The quarry was almost worked out when Tracey Enterprises Limited sold it to Kilsaran Concrete Limited and was due to close in 2012. The overall size of the quarry Tracey Enterprises Ltd sold to Kilsaran Concrete was 25.2 Hectares.

Section 261A will promote further environmental destruction, to add to the last decade of what can only be described as the worst Planning and Development in the history of the State .

Should SDCC decide to proceed with Section 261A of the Planning and Development Act 2000 -2011 we request that we be informed about all quarries that are included and notified by SDCC including Shillelagh Quarries Limited and Kilsaran Concrete Limited.

Dear Sirs,

In response to the notice published by South Dublin County Council in December 2011 (the "Notice") pursuant to section 261A of the Planning Acts, we hereby make the following submission in relation to the existing quarry at Ballinascorney Upr., Brittas, County Dublin (the "Ballinascorney Quarry") owned and operated by Kilsaran Concrete (Ballinascorney) Limited t/a Kilsaran Build (for convenience, "Kilsaran").

The Notice specifies certain matters to be determined by South Dublin County Council in relation to every quarry within their functional area:

1. Whether environmental impact assessment ("EIA"), a determination as to whether EIA was required (sometimes called screening for EIA) or appropriate assessment ("AA"), were required but not carried out for the quarry;
2. Whether the quarry commenced operation prior to 1 October 1964 or was granted planning permission after that date;
3. If applicable, whether the requirement to register under section 261 of the Planning Acts was fulfilled.

Before addressing each of these matters, it is necessary to set out the planning history of the Ballinascorney Quarry.

1. Planning History

The Ballinascorney Quarry is located in the townlands of Ballinascorney Upper, Aghfarrell and Mountseskin, part on registered lands comprised within Land

The Ballinascorney Quarry commenced operation in the early 1970s. The extent of the extracted area is illustrated in recent aerial photographs published by the Ordnance Survey. See **attached** photograph from 2009.

A summary of the planning history is **attached**. There are three principal permissions relevant to quarrying activity. These were granted in 1971 (two) and 1993 (ref. nos. unknown, K/3021 and 93A/346). The application for the last permission was accompanied by an environmental impact statement and was only granted after the planning authority carried out an environmental impact assessment.

On or about 25 April 2005, the quarry was registered by the planning authority under section 261 of the Planning Acts (ref. no. SDQU05A/6). On or about 25 April 2007, the planning authority made a decision to modify the existing planning conditions, deleting the existing conditions and replacing them with 36 no. conditions.

The limit and extent of these planning permissions have been considered by An Bord Pleanála (the "Board") when determining referrals made under section 5 of the Planning Acts regarding:

- (a) whether the installation of new fixed plant and machinery, the installation of additional new fixed plant and machinery and the expansion of quarrying activity at Ballinascorney Upper, Brittas, Co. Dublin beyond the 25.2 hectares permitted by condition number 4 of the modified conditions imposed under register reference number SDQU05A/6 is or is not development and is or is not exempted development; and,
- (b) whether the excavation and formation of two earthen mounds, drilling and blasting of rock, processing of stone, excavation of stone, excavation on or near an archaeological monument and excavation of top and subsoil, all outside a permitted 25.2 hectares quarry extraction area at Ballinascorney Upper, Brittas, Co. Dublin are or are not development and are or are not exempted development.

The significance of these determinations is considered below.

There are several ancillary permissions for site infrastructure, including construction and demolition waste recovery, which were granted in 1977, 1980, 1985, 1990, 1991, 1994, 2007 and 2008.

2. **Whether EIA, screening for EIA or AA, were required but not carried out.**

We are advised that the relevant test to be applied, under Section 261A(2) of the Planning Acts, is:

- (a) whether development was carried out after 1 February 1990 in respect of which EIA, or screening for EIA was required; or

- (b) whether development was carried out after 26 February 1997 in respect of which AA was required.

If there was, then the planning authority must consider whether the necessary EIA, screening for EIA or AA was carried out.

We believe it is clear from the planning history that:

- no environmental impact assessment was required for development carried out under the 1971 permissions. This development cannot be the subject of a determination under section 261 A(2)(a);
- environmental impact assessment was carried out by South Dublin County Council before planning permission was granted for an extension of the Ballinascorney Quarry in 1993. It follows that development authorised under that permission cannot be the subject of a determination under section 261 A(2)(a); and,
- no environmental impact assessment was required for the ancillary development carried out under permission granted in 1977, 1980, 1985, 1990, 1991, 1994, 2007 and 2008.

There has been some expansion of the quarry to the north of the original redline boundary of the 1993 permission.

Specifically, by letter dated 20 January 2012, South Dublin County Council has indicated an area of 5.32 hectares marked with blue hatching, within which they suggest some development was carried out before June 2009.

Although described by the planning authority as "quarry works", the activities within this area can only have included two earthen mounds and removal of overburden (~2.5 hectares), within which there has been some rock extraction (~1.5 hectares). The Board has determined that the earthen mounds comprise exempted development (ref. no. PL06S.RL2577) and that overburden removal and extraction only outside a specific area of 25.2 hectares comprises development (ref. nos. PL06S.RL2486 and PL06S.RL2577).

The matter can only be understood with reference to the decision to modify the existing planning conditions made by South Dublin County Council on 25 April 2007 (ref. no. SDQU05A/6).

Condition no. 1 of that decision states:

"Quarrying operations on the lands shall be carried out in accordance with the plans, particulars and specifications as described in the documents lodged with the application for registration of the quarry under Section 261 of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as revised by Additional Information received on 28th September 2005, including the Site Map Sheets KC0001 and KC0002, save as the conditions hereunder require."

Condition no. 4 of that decision states:

"The extraction of rock on the subject lands shall be limited to a continuous and total area of not more than 25.2 hectares to include the area within the green coloured line as indicated on Site Map Sheet KC0001 submitted as Additional Information on 28 September 2005. No extract of rock shall be undertaken on any part of the lands outside the said area unless a separate planning permission has been granted for such a development. Within three months of the date of this decision a map to a suitable scale showing the precise extent of the permitted area of extraction shall be submitted for the written agreement of the planning authority."

You will see that these conditions require quarrying to be carried out in accordance with certain prescribed documents and limit rock extraction to a continuous area of 25.2 hectares to include (and therefore not limited to) the area within the green coloured area indicated on Site Map Sheet KC0001. A copy of Site Map Sheet KC0001 is **attached**.

By virtue of section 261(6)(b) of the Planning Acts, condition no. 4 takes effect as if imposed under section 34. This condition has been complied with at all times. We believe that development under and in accordance with these conditions (i.e., within the specified 25.2 hectares) is lawful.

That view has been confirmed by the Board when determining references made under section 5 of the Planning Acts. Specifically, the Board has determined two references connected with activities outside the 25.2 hectares (ref. nos. PL06S.RL2486 and PL06S.RL2577). In the first of those referrals, the Board determined that:

"the expansion of quarrying activity beyond the 25.2 hectares permitted by condition number 4 of the modified conditions imposed under register reference number SDQU05A/6 is not exempted development".

There may be some confusion, given correspondence issued by the planning authority in recent weeks. Under and accordance with condition no. 4 of the revised conditions, Kilsaran, in good faith, submitted plans "showing the precise extent of the permitted area of extraction". That was done on 27 August 2007 and, as required by condition no. 4, it included "the area within the green coloured area indicated on Site Map Sheet KC0001". That plan illustrated the full extent of the 25.2 hectares as understood by Kilsaran to be authorised by condition nos. 1 and 4 of the modified conditions. A copy of the plan submitted in August 2007 is **attached**.

No response was received from the planning authority until 22 December 2011. Kilsaran understood the planning authority to be satisfied with the August 2007 plan. The four-year delay in communicating any different view is disappointing.

It appears the planning authority has now formed the view that the "permitted area of extraction" is more limited. It appears that the planning

authority does not accept that, by virtue of section 261(6)(b) of the Planning Acts, condition nos. 1 and 4 take effect as if imposed under section 34 and thereby authorises development within the 25.2 hectares as understood by Kilsaran to be authorised by condition nos. 1 and 4 of the modified conditions.

Kilsaran accept that the planning authority must consider the following issues in connection with the comparatively minor extraction to the north of the original redline boundary to the 1993 permission, namely:

- (i) whether it comprises development;
- (ii) if so, whether that development required EIA, screening for EIA or AA;
- (iii) if so, whether any EIA, screening for EIA or AA was carried out.

As explained, this comprises removal of overburden (~2.5 hectares), within which there has been some rock extraction (~1.5 hectares). While the removal of overburden and rock extraction have been authorised by condition nos. 1 and 4 of the revised conditions, no environmental impact statement or Natura impact statement was prepared as part of the registration process under section 261.

While we are not convinced that a determination under section 261A(2)(a)(i) or (ii) should be made, Kilsaran is prepared to submit to section 261A(3) of the Planning Acts and prepare an application for substitute consent. Assuming that subsection (3) is applied to the Ballinascorney Quarry, Kilsaran will not question a determination that EIA, screening for EIA or AA was required, but not carried out.

3. Whether the quarry commenced operation prior to 1 October 1964 or was granted permission after that date.

It is clear from the planning history that planning permission for the Ballinascorney Quarry was granted after 1 October 1964. There can be no dispute about this.

We note there is no requirement under section 261A(3) for the planning authority to consider compliance with conditions. Indeed, we have been advised that the determination to be made by the planning authority under subsection (3) does not involve or require any assessment of whether activities at the quarry have at all times been lawful.

4. If applicable, whether the requirement to register under Section 261 of the Planning Acts was fulfilled.

By virtue of section 261(11)(a), requirement to register under section 261 applied to the Ballinascorney Quarry.

On or about 25 April 2005, the quarry was registered by the planning authority under section 261 of the Planning Acts (ref. no. SDQU05A/6). On or about 25 April 2007, the planning authority made a decision to modify the existing planning conditions, deleting the existing conditions and replacing them with 36 no. conditions.

5. **Whether Section 261A(5) of the Planning Acts could apply.**

Finally, we note that Section 261A(5) addresses the very specific circumstances where certain development took place after 3 July 2008 and that development, of itself, required EIA, screening for EIA or AA.

An attempt to describe the extent of development at the northern extent of the quarry was made by a neighbour in a reference made under section 5 on or about 8 August 2008 (ref. no. PL06S.RL.2577, which bore the planning authority ref. no. ED08/0020). It is clear from this and the planning history that nothing comprising development that required EIA, screening for EIA or AA had taken place since 3 July 2008.

We trust this is in order. Should you require any further information on any aspect of this submission, please do not hesitate to contact myself, Fergus Gallagher.

As explained, Kilsaran is willing to submit to section 261A(3) of the Planning Acts and prepare an application for substitute consent. Assuming that subsection (3) is applied to the Ballinascorney Quarry, Kilsaran will not question a determination that EIA, screening for EIA or AA was required, but not carried out. For the reasons described above, Kilsaran believe that the Ballinascorney Quarry satisfies the requirements of subsection (3)(a).

I refer to the above and wish to make the following observations by way of invited submissions to SDCC and refer to the Notice on the website at Nr. 5 where it states “ *Any person may make submissions or observation in writing without payment of a fee, to south Dublin County Council in relation to any quarry in its administrative area not later than 6 weeks after the date of this notice.* ” .

I wish to draw attention to the illegal quarry at Aghfarrell, Brittas Co Dublin and operated by Shillelagh Quarries Limited.

The application made in respect of this quarry under section 261 was not properly considered and there was false information submitted on foot of the application form with regard to the ownership of the lands contained in folios which no longer existed and where the unauthorized development was taking place. South Dublin County Council granted permission for continuance of use in full knowledge that the operation was illegal and thankfully the decision of SDCC, which was *ultra vires* has been overturned by An Bord Pleanala by order dated 24th December 2010.

The subject quarry is still being investigated by the senior planner who granted permission for continuance of use and has now been given the enforcement file to regularize various breaches and illegality, however there has been no meaningful action or any visible action taken to date by SDCC against the owner or operators of the illegal quarry.

This beggars belief and I am awaiting an explanation from Mr Horan, the County Manager to account for this and explain why the same planner who granted permission for a known illegal and unauthorized operation at lands in Aghfarrell, has now charge of an enforcement file to which much of the irregularity consequently arising, can be attributed to him granting permission (*ultra vires*) in the first place, for a known illegal and unauthorized development.

I submit that the proposals contained in the above review raise concern regarding this particular quarry and any attempt to alter the procedures of Section 261A of the Planning and Development Act 2000 as proposed by SDCC for control, could in circumstances where it to allow or permit to create;

- (i) *further opportunity to re-apply under the section 261a where the operators of this unauthorized development, possess no planning permission by way of order of ABP.*

- (ii) *which was previously determined by the High Court to be an unauthorized development.*

- (iii) *the subject site in which the illegal operations continue to take place is not a quarry pre October 1st 1964.*

The above if permitted to unfold would likely result in the matter being complained of further in other forums and through procedures provided for under EU directives and reported to other superior authority notwithstanding the provision for the matter to be referred to ABP.

There is still no provision for third party evidence or participation in the application for a section 261 and accordingly this remains open to constitutional challenge. The proposed changes under the review would significantly add to excluding third parties from participation in this process as a review does not contain proposals to allow for same.

Accordingly in the circumstances I do not believe that the “ review” of quarries as proposed, can be trusted by the public and in particular to the above named illegal quarry to be open or fair.

This submission is made on behalf of Shillelagh Quarries Ltd. with an address at Aghfarrell, Brittas, Co. Dublin in response to the public notice issued by South Dublin County Council in the Irish Times, dated 7th December 2011 inviting submissions or observations in relation to the statutory review of quarries under Section 261A of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended) – Further Matters in the Control of Quarries.

1.0 SECTION 261 REGISTRATION

Shillelagh Quarries Ltd. registered the quarry at Aghfarrell with South Dublin Co. Council as required under Section 261 of the Planning & Development Act, 2000 (Quarry Ref. No. SDQU05A/1) on the 20th April 2005.

A subsequent public notice issued by South Dublin County Council advised that the quarry at Aghfarrell was registered in accordance with Section 261 of the Planning & Development Act and stating;

'Planning permission has not been granted for this quarry. The PA is considering requiring the making of a planning application and the preparation of an environmental impact statement (EIS) in respect of the quarry in accordance with subsection (7) of Section 261 of the Act.

Notification to Shillelagh Quarries Ltd. by South Dublin County Council under Section 261(5) requested that a planning application and accompanying EIS be submitted in relation to the quarry at Aghfarrell.

2.0 PLANNING APPLICATION SUBMITTED UNDER SECTION 261

Shillelagh Quarries Ltd. submitted a planning application and accompanying EIS to South Dublin Co. Council. (Planning Ref. No. SD07A.0276), as required under the provisions of Section 261. This application includes the existing quarry area and a proposed extension area. South Dublin Co. Council issued a notification of decision to grant planning permission for the development. This decision was subject to first and third party appeals to An Bord Pleanála. The Board overturned South Dublin Co. Council's decision and refused planning permission.

Shillelagh Quarries Ltd. is currently engaged in court proceedings (Record No. 2011/154JR) with An Bord Pleanála in relation to the Board's decision to overturn the grant of planning permission by South Dublin County Council (Planning Ref. No. SD07A/0276 and ABP Ref. No. PL06S.231371) for the proposed development being:

“(A) Continuance of use of the existing quarry on lands that have been used for this purpose since before 1st October 1964 on a site registered under Section 261 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (Quarry Reference Number SDQU05A/1); (B) all existing ancillary facilities including the existing processing plant (crushing and screening plant), overburden storage areas, stockpile areas, water management system and the truck/vehicle parking area; (C) extension of the existing quarry extraction area by 4.2 hectares, within the registered area, to give a total extraction area of 15.5 hectares within an overall application area of 28.1 hectares; (D) provision of a wheelwash and hydrocarbon interceptor; (E) landscaping and final restoration of the site, all at Aghfarrell townland, Brittas, Co. Dublin.”

This submission in relation to Section 261A is made without prejudice to any position Shillelagh Quarries Ltd's may take in relation to and arising from the above High Court proceedings. In that regard, it is submitted, that it is appropriate to await the outcome of those proceedings, due to be heard in March 2012, before a determination is made on whether an application for substituted consent should be made

3.0 SECTION 261A

It is clear from the original quarry registration process that the local authority accepted the status of the quarry at Aghfarrell as being a quarry that commenced operation before 1st October 1964 and having an extraction area which was greater than 5 hectares at the time of registration and thereby registered it in accordance with subsection (7) of Section 261 of the Planning & Development Act.

Shillelagh Quarries Ltd. would also like to point out that it could have been quite conceivably foreseen before 1st October 1964 that the quarry would continue to operate and expand within the same single landholding boundary (Folio DN3636).

Shillelagh Quarries Ltd. has operated the quarry in accordance with the recommended environmental management guidelines for the sector (DoEHLG (2004) and EPA(2006). There is an ongoing environmental monitoring programme in place at the quarry that confirms compliance with the recommended emission limit values for noise, dust deposition

and air overpressure / groundborne vibration. The quarry operation is not resulting in significant effects on the environment.

It is respectfully requested that South Dublin County Council now make a determination that an application should be made to the Board for substitute consent with regard to the quarry at Aghfarrell under Section 261A (1)(b), being:

“that where the planning authority determines in relation to a quarry that an environmental impact assessment, a determination as to whether environmental impact assessment was required, or an appropriate assessment, was require but was not carried out and the planning authority also decides that –

- (i) The quarry commenced operation prior to 1st October 1964, or permission was granted in respect of the quarry under Part III of the Planning and Development Act 2000 or Part IV of the Local Government (Planning and Development) Act 1963, and*
- (ii) If applicable, the requirements in relation to registration under section 261 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 were fulfilled.”*

It is clear from the original quarry registration process that the local authority accepted the status of the quarry at Aghfarrell as being a quarry that commenced operation before 1st October 1964 and having an extraction area which was greater than 5 hectares and thereby required an application for planning permission and an EIS to be submitted in accordance with subsection (7) of Section 261 of the Planning & Development Act. Further, it is clear that the requirements in relation to registration under section 261 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 were fulfilled. In so far as the EIS that accompanied planning application (Planning Ref. No. SD07A.0276) is concerned, this was not exclusively for the quarry that commenced operation before 1st October 1964 as it considered other development, for example, the extension of the existing quarry extraction area by 4.2 hectares. Thus, it is submitted, that an environmental impact assessment for the quarry *per se* was required and was not carried out

We would like to make the following submission on Section 261A of the Planning and Development Act 2000 – 2011:-

(1) Shillelagh Quarries Limited. (SDQU 05A/1) and others

- (a) We must point out that SDCC granted planning permission to Shillelagh Quarries Limited "Ultra Vires". SDCC failed to carry out even a basic check of Public records despite the fact that we had requested a full investigation into this unauthorised quarry. SDCC failed to request from Shillelagh Quarries Limited proof of Pre- 1964 status, ownership of land, etc. despite knowing that it was an unauthorised quarry with a very long history.
- (b) We would like to know why the same planning officer who granted planning permission to Shillelagh Quarries Limited has been appointed enforcement officer to this case by Mr Horan. This is not appropriate or acceptable.
- (c) Both Section 261 and 261A are developer led and probably represent some of the most ill-conceived and blatant Legislation drafted in the Planning Act. Both section 261 and 261A are designed to legitimise unauthorised and fraudulent quarries in breach of ECJ C/215/06 , 85/337/EEC. Section 261A designed to give a second chance to the owners of the unauthorised quarries.
- (d) It is a scandal that the Minister for the Environment has enacted and is promoting such legislation.

- (d) Section 261A we believe is in breach of the ECJ case C/215/06. 85/337/EEC.
This we believe will result in cases returning to the ECJ once again. Resulting in Large fines being levied on the citizen's of this State once again, as a result of Incompetent governance.

We request that SDCC carry out immediate enforcement action under Section 154 for this unauthorised quarry (Shillelagh Quarries Limited). The decision by An Bord Pleanala was made on the 24-12-2010 and we believe SDCC have not taken any enforcement action to date.

(2) Kilsaran Concrete Limited:- SDQU05A/6

- (a) SDCC granted an extra 6.676 Hectares for quarrying without Kilsaran Concrete Limited making any planning application for such a development. The area of this quarry is now 31.876 Hectares.
- (b) No adequate Environmental Impact Assessment/Appropriate assessment was carried out prior to the grant of planning permission to Kilsaran Concrete Limited.
- (c) This quarry was granted an additional 5 years duration in the planning permission to 2017. The quarry was almost worked out when Tracey Enterprises Limited sold it to Kilsaran Concrete Limited and was due to close in 2012. The overall size of the quarry Tracey Enterprises Ltd sold to Kilsaran Concrete was 25.2 Hectares.

Section 261A will promote further environmental destruction, to add to the last decade of what can only be described as the worst Planning and Development in the history of the State .

Should SDCC decide to proceed with Section 261A of the Planning and Development Act 2000 -2011 we request that we be informed about all quarries that are included and notified by SDCC including Shillelagh Quarries Limited and Kilsaran Concrete Limited.

I refer to the above and wish to make the following observations by way of invited submissions to SDCC and refer to the Notice on the website at Nr. 5 where it states “ *Any person may make submissions or observation in writing without payment of a fee, to south Dublin County Council in relation to any quarry in its administrative area not later than 6 weeks after the date of this notice.* ” .

I wish to draw attention to the illegal quarry at Aghfarrell, Brittas Co Dublin and operated by Shillelagh Quarries Limited.

The application made in respect of this quarry under section 261 was not properly considered and there was false information submitted on foot of the application form with regard to the ownership of the lands contained in folios which no longer existed and where the unauthorized development was taking place. South Dublin County Council granted permission for continuance of use in full knowledge that the operation was illegal and thankfully the decision of SDCC, which was *ultra vires* has been overturned by An Bord Pleanala by order dated 24th December 2010.

The subject quarry is still being investigated by the senior planner who granted permission for continuance of use and has now been given the enforcement file to regularize various breaches and illegality, however there has been no meaningful action or any visible action taken to date by SDCC against the owner or operators of the illegal quarry.

This beggars belief and I am awaiting an explanation from Mr Horan, the County Manager to account for this and explain why the same planner who granted permission for a known illegal and unauthorized operation at lands in Aghfarrell, has now charge of an enforcement file to which much of the irregularity consequently arising, can be attributed to him granting permission (*ultra vires*) in the first place, for a known illegal and unauthorized development.

I submit that the proposals contained in the above review raise concern regarding this particular quarry and any attempt to alter the procedures of Section 261A of the Planning and Development Act 2000 as proposed by SDCC for control, could in circumstances where it to allow or permit to create;

- (i) *further opportunity to re-apply under the section 261a where the operators of this unauthorized development, possess no planning permission by way of order of ABP.*

- (ii) *which was previously determined by the High Court to be an unauthorized development.*

- (iii) *the subject site in which the illegal operations continue to take place is not a quarry pre October 1st 1964.*

The above if permitted to unfold would likely result in the matter being complained of further in other forums and through procedures provided for under EU directives and reported to other superior authority notwithstanding the provision for the matter to be referred to ABP.

There is still no provision for third party evidence or participation in the application for a section 261 and accordingly this remains open to constitutional challenge. The proposed changes under the review would significantly add to excluding third parties from participation in this process as a review does not contain proposals to allow for same.

Accordingly in the circumstances I do not believe that the “ review” of quarries as proposed, can be trusted by the public and in particular to the above named illegal quarry to be open or fair.

1. LEGAL OBLIGATIONS ON COUNCIL

There is a Legal onus on Council to address the status of all quarries in its functional area with regard to compliance with the EIA and Habitats Directives and relevant European and Irish Court judgements.

European Court of Justice Judgement Case C.215-08 debars retention for development subject to Environmental Impact Assessment. European Court of Justice Judgement of March 2011 in Case C.50-09 ruled that Ireland has failed to fulfil its obligation under Article 3 of the EIA Directive in assessing projects coming under the Directive .

There are significant habitat impacts generated by quarrying of any kind, be it whole or in part, often results in the destruction of existing habitat and destruction e.g. rare karst and cave systems. Such quarrying invariably also results in habitat loss and a denigration of bio-diversity. Quarrying also renders agricultural/ horticultural land useless coupled with a loss of carbon sink. This raises issue of requirement of Appropriate Assessment under Habitats Directive
