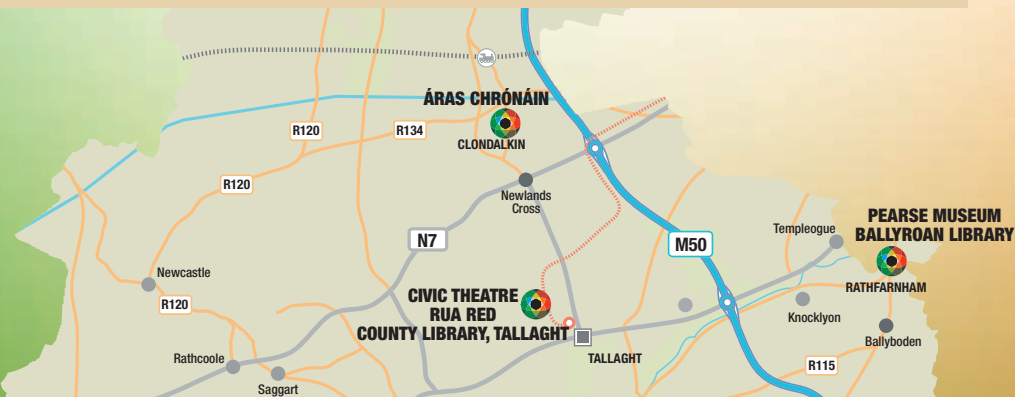

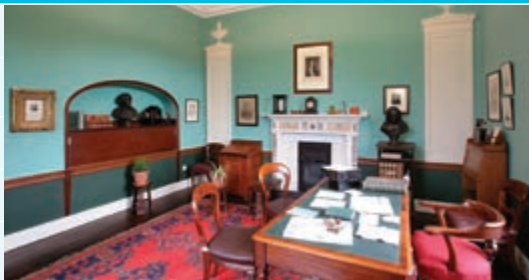

Ballyroan Library is proud to present “Was the Great War a Good War for Ireland?” – a talk by Pádraig Yeates. Pádraig is a journalist, publicist, trade union activist and author of the acclaimed “A City in Wartime: Dublin 1914-18”. In the years 1914 to 1918 Dublin was utterly transformed. It was still recovering from the divisive class warfare of the 1913 Lockout when the First World War broke out. Twenty-five thousand men joined the British Army while the Easter Rising of 1916 transformed the city into a rebel stronghold. Dublin as we know it was shaped in these years.
